

LAUNDRY *plus* MUDROOM

DUAL PURPOSE Two well-equipped zones keep clean laundry separate from muddy shoes, but having both functions in one room means wet or stained garments can go directly into the wash. In the laundry area, closed cabinets hide detergent and cleaning supplies, while on the mudroom side, rows of hooks and benches make it easy to grab a coat or tie laces. A central counter-height cart bridges the two sides. Its height makes it ideal for folding, and a lower shelf and bins can store shoes or corral lone socks. Textural rope on the light fixture and collage-like artwork by Ronan Boyle elevate the room above the strictly utilitarian.
